Both hypoactive and hyperactive delirium states are recognised and often patients exhibit features of both. Patients may appear confused or 'not with it' when talking to them. Alternatively, it may be their family or carer noticing the confusion.

Brain disorders such as dementia, stroke or parkinson's disease are possible risk factors for acute confusional state or delirium. These extreme episodes are uncommon for most people who have confusional arousals. One variation of confusional arousals is called severe morning sleep inertia. It can affect teens and adults.
