Dogwood Winter is a cold spell that occurs after spring seems to have arrived (in Kentucky, usually mid April) and while the dogwood trees are in bloom. In the northern parts of Kentucky or where dogwoods are uncommon, it may be called locust winter

for the tree that blooms at about the same time.

Dogwood trees have a naturally attractive rounded shape, so they require little pruning unless needed for aesthetic reasons or to improve their vigor. The best time to prune is in the late fall or winter while the tree is dormant. Watering: Water your dogwood on a regular basis until it is established.

Dogwood Winter - Mid- to late April, when the dogwood trees bloom. Often a heavy frost falls in dogwood winter. Blackberry Winter - Early to mid-May, when blackberries are in full bloom. In the Tennessee mountains, this often coincides with the last frost of spring, which can kill new plantings on the farm.

## **Blackberry Winter & Other Tennessee Little Winters ...**

In spring, dogwood trees explode with white (or sometimes pink or red) bracts centered with small clusters of yellow flowers. In spring, these native trees (*Cornus florida*), which grow only to 20 to 30 feet, explode with white (or sometimes pink or red) bracts centered with small clusters of yellow flowers, shouting that winter is finally over.

Noted for its 4 seasons of interest, *Cornus florida* f. *rubra* (Pink Flowering Dogwood) is a small deciduous tree adorned with a broadly conical canopy. In spring, profuse star-like blooms, 3-4 in. across (7-10 cm), appear usually before the leaves. They consist of four narrowly pointed pink to reddish pink bracts which surround the center cluster of tiny green flowers.

The flowering dogwood (*Cornus florida*) is a small, deciduous ornamental tree that is native throughout the eastern United States. Although dogwoods are well adapted to South Carolina, they can be affected by many pests and diseases.
