Phase II orthodontic treatment (see Box 83-6) for a cleft patient consists of maintaining maxillary arch width after repair of the alveolar cleft, monitoring eruption of permanent teeth adjacent to the grafted cleft site, and aligning permanent teeth with full fixed appliances. Orthodontic treatment should be timed appropriately based on the need for orthognathic surgery, the individual's growth potential, ability to cooperate, and ability to maintain oral hygiene.

The Phases of Orthodontic Treatment. Generally, orthodontic treatment takes between six and thirty months to complete. The treatment time will largely depend on the classification of the malocclusion, the type of dental devices used to correct it and the perseverance of the patient. Here is a general overview of the three major stages of treatment:

Orthodontic headgear—sometimes referred to as an "extra-oral appliance"—is a treatment approach that requires the patient to have a device strapped onto his or her head to help correct malocclusion—typically used when the teeth do not align properly.
